OFCC Study Findings and Facts about the Schools

OFCC Findings Summary

Price tag to bring our current aging buildings up to standard would be exorbitant.

Renovations would be 2/3 of the cost of constructing new buildings.

Facts about the Avon Lake Schools

- Buildings were built from 50's early 70's
- Advances in educational instruction methodologies, curriculum demands based on in demand careers and technology have outpaced our infrastructure
- Population growth and traffic have created safety issues or overcrowding around schools and in neighborhoods
- Current structure of K-8 facilities is inefficient and leads to higher operating costs
- Harder to maintain the buildings and some of the upgrades to older buildings would be cost prohibitive (ex. air conditioning)



Facilities Committee & Board



Committee Members: Parents, Staff, Administrators, and 2 School Board Members.

Reviewed and assessed findings of the OFCC study and discussed options for the future.



Expressed a need to bring professional experts into the conversation. The first being an architect.



The Board oversaw the architect contracting RFP and selected Fanning Howey to provide pre-bond service work.



Enrollment projection commissioned through FutureThink; Fall '22 - study has forward looking view to how many families and students the school district will be serving in the future.

Decisions Made to Date

Facilities Committee studied over 10 possible building configuration options and grade level options and leveraged Fanning Howey's expertise and history with other school districts



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Background on Bond Issues

- A bond issue is a way school districts fund future capital needs such as new construction and capital improvements
- A bond issue **can** only be used for construction purposes (site acquisition, new buildings, renovation, etc.)
- A bond issue **cannot** be used for general operating expenditures such as salaries, utilities, etc.



Avon Lake School District Current Outstanding Bonds

Amount	Date Bond Issue Passed
\$41,800,000	May 1999
\$13,000,000	November 2009
\$5,500,000	November 2009



Unique Opportunity, but Timing is Key

- Important to determine financial options available sooner than later given design and construction takes several years to complete
- One financing option available is associated with the \$41.8M bond issue that was passed in 1999
- Prior to its expiration, the voters could approve the County Auditor to continue collections at the millage associated with the 1999 issue – this would help offset approximately \$50M in new construction costs
- **Timing is Key:** To take advantage of this opportunity, the new bond issue must pass prior to the expiration of the original bond issue


